

Call for Hosting Applications

2nd EAHL Young Scholars workshop

The European Association of Health Law (EAHL) is pleased to announce an open call for members to apply to host the 2nd EAHL Young Scholars Workshop. This biennial event aims to foster collaboration, knowledge exchange, and networking opportunities for doctoral and post-doctoral researchers in health law across Europe.

We invite universities, research institutions, and other academic organizations with staff of EAHL members to submit a proposal to host this event.

Workshop Overview:

- Event Title: 2nd EAHL Young Scholars Workshop
- Date: preferably April or May 2025 (to be determined in consultation with the host institution and EAHL)
- Location: Proposed by the host institution
- Duration: 2–3 days (minimum two full working days)
- Expected Participants: Minimum 50
- Workshop Structure:
 - Keynote presentation on a topic of general importance to the field of health law and of interest to young scholars, followed by an academic discussion on the main topic of the event
 - Workshop on or of relevance to research methods in health law
 - Parallel sessions with ample time for feedback on the participants' work
 - Networking opportunities
 - Social program, including at least one joint dinner

Eligibility:

To apply, institutions must meet the following requirements:

1. Have at least one faculty member who is an EAHL member
2. Provide suitable facilities, including a lecture hall, breakout rooms, and spaces for networking
3. Demonstrate a commitment to supporting young scholars in health law

Proposal Requirements:

Proposals should include the following information:

1. Institutional Information:
 - Name of the institution
 - Local organizer(s): workshop coordinator and organizing team
 - Faculty member(s) affiliated with EAHL

2. Venue Details:
 - Description of the proposed venue (university campus or another appropriate location)
 - Available workshop facilities (lecture hall, seminar rooms, catering services, technical support)
 - Accessibility (proximity to public transportation, airports, etc.)
3. Proposed Dates:
 - Suggested dates for the workshop
4. Workshop Agenda Outline:
 - Proposed agenda based on the workshop structure mentioned above
5. Budget and Funding Plan:
 - Estimated costs for venue, catering, technical equipment, and logistics
 - Potential funding sources (e.g., sponsorships, institutional support, registration fees, EAHL sponsorships)
6. Accommodation Options:
 - Details on accommodation options for participants (suggested hotels, university housing, affordable lodging)
7. Social Program:
 - Plans for social and cultural activities that promote networking, including at least one joint dinner
8. Support Services:
 - Administrative and technical support for organizing and executing the workshop
 - Details on assistive technologies and accommodations for participants with disabilities
 - Support for attendees with young children
9. Measures taken to ensure the well-being of all participants, as well as a safe environment

Young Scholar's Workshop Host's and EAHL collaboration:

EAHL is committed to offer a maximum of 20 sponsorships for young scholars in the amount up to 500 (five hundred) euros each as the reimbursement of travel expenses, accommodation costs during the workshop and workshop fee.

Selection Criteria:

Applications will be evaluated based on:

- a) Potential to attract young scholars in health law from across Europe
- b) Relevance and strength of the proposed program to foster scientific exchange and networking
- c) Availability of strong local partners for the organizing team
- d) Attractiveness, accessibility, and suitability of the workshop venue
- e) Feasibility of the budget and funding plan
- f) Experience in hosting similar academic events

Selection Process

Each board member will independently score the applications (on a scale of 1 to 7). Board members affiliated with an applicant institution will not participate in the selection process. Scores will be used as a basis for the final discussion. The board's decision will be an outcome of the final discussion, and will be an overall assessment. The final outcome may differ from initial scores. The final decision will be made public, and applicants will receive feedback on their total score per criterion, but will not be provided with individual board members' scores.

Application Deadline:

All proposals must be submitted by **28 November 2024**. Late submissions will not be considered.

Submission Process:
