**Conference of the European Association of Health Law (EAHL)
“Navigating the Frontiers of Health Law in an Evolving Europe”

The European Association of Health Law (EAHL), jointly with Uppsala University, as the local organizer, is pleased to announce its upcoming conference, scheduled to take place from **Wednesday, 9 September to Friday, 11 September 2026**. This event aspires to gather legal scholars, as well as policymakers, legal professionals, healthcare practitioners, and other interested parties, to explore the state of the law and necessary critical developments in European health law.

As Europe grapples with a range of health challenges—including an aging population, mental health concerns, antimicrobial resistance, infectious and lifestyle-related diseases, and environmental health issues—the role of health law is more critical than ever. Ensuring the equitable distribution of healthcare resources while adapting to rapid advancements in digitalization, technology, and care delivery is essential to strengthening healthcare services, improving patient outcomes, and safeguarding public health and individual rights.

Through the lens of an “Evolving Europe,” the conference will consider socio-economic and cultural challenges alongside the regulatory and systemic shifts needed in European health law. These include rethinking regulatory approaches within Europe’s diverse legal landscape, reshaping public health systems, and clarifying the roles of public and private stakeholders. Additionally, it will explore the impact of collaboration and incentives, as well as the role of intellectual property law and the constraints imposed by competition law.

This dynamic forum aspires to foster dialogue and collaboration, contributing to the evolution of health law in response to Europe's changing socio-economic and cultural realities.
