



## **Call for applications to host the 3rd EAHL Young Scholars Workshop**

The European Association of Health Law (EAHL) invites its Members to apply to host the 3rd EAHL Young Scholars Workshop. This biennial event aims to foster collaboration, knowledge exchange, and networking among doctoral and postdoctoral researchers in health law across Europe.

Universities, research institutions, and other academic organisations with EAHL members on staff are invited to submit a proposal to host the workshop.

### **Workshop Overview**

- Title: 3rd EAHL Young Scholars Workshop
- Date: Preferably spring or autumn 2027 (to be determined in consultation with the host institution and EAHL)
- Location: To be proposed by the host institution
- Duration: 2–3 days (minimum two full working days)
- Expected participants: Minimum 25

The workshop programme should include:

- A keynote presentation on a topic of general importance to the field of European health law and of interest to young scholars, followed by academic discussion
- A workshop on research methods in health law (or other relevant methodological topics)
- Parallel sessions with sufficient time for feedback on participants' work
- Networking opportunities
- A social programme, including at least one joint dinner

### **Eligibility**

Applicant institutions must:

1. Have at least one faculty member who is an EAHL member.
2. Provide suitable facilities, including a lecture hall, breakout rooms, and networking spaces.
3. Demonstrate a commitment to supporting young scholars in health law.

## **Proposal Requirements**

Proposals should include:

1. Institutional information
  - Name of the institution
  - Local organiser(s): workshop coordinator and organising team
  - Faculty member(s) affiliated with EAHL
  - Relevant previous organizational experience, and how organizing the YS Workshop strengthens the applicant's position in the field
2. Venue details
  - Description of the proposed venue (university campus or another appropriate location)
  - Available facilities (lecture hall, seminar rooms, catering services, technical support)
  - Accessibility (proximity to public transportation, airports, etc.)
3. Proposed dates
4. Workshop agenda outline, and relevance to the European health law
5. Budget and funding plan
  - Estimated costs (venue, catering, technical equipment, logistics)
  - Potential funding sources (e.g. sponsorships, institutional support, registration fees for YS participants, EAHL sponsorship)
6. Accommodation options
  - Information on suggested hotels, university housing, or other affordable lodging
7. Social programme
  - Plans for social and cultural activities that promote networking, including at least one joint dinner
8. Inclusiveness
  - Functional variation
  - Interdisciplinarity
  - Gender balance
  - Nationality diversification
  - Support for young scholars with children during the event (e.g., information on publicly available facilities)
9. Support services
  - Administrative and technical support for organising and delivering the workshop
  - Assistive technologies and accommodations for participants with disabilities
  - Support for attendees with young children
  - Measures to ensure the well-being and safety of all participants
10. Any available measures to facilitate participation

## **Collaboration with EAHL**

EAHL will offer up to 20 sponsorships for young scholars, each of up to €500, to cover workshop registration fee, travel expenses, accommodation during the workshop.

## **Selection Criteria**

Applications will be evaluated based on:

- a) Potential to attract young scholars in health law from across Europe
- b) Relevance and strength of the proposed program to foster scientific exchange and networking
- c) Availability of strong local partners for the organizing team
- d) Attractiveness, accessibility, and suitability of the workshop venue
- e) Feasibility of the budget and funding plan
- f) Experience in hosting similar academic events.

## **Selection Process**

Each Board member will independently score the applications on a scale from 1 to 10. Board members affiliated with an applicant institution will not participate in the selection process.

The scores will form the basis for the Board's discussion for final discussion. The Board's decision will be a result based on an overall assessment and may differ from the initial scores and the Board's evaluative discussions. The final decision will be made public. Applicants will receive feedback on their total score per criterion, but not on individual Board members' scores.

## **Application Deadline**

Proposals must be submitted by 31 August 2026. Late submissions will not be considered.

## **Submission**
