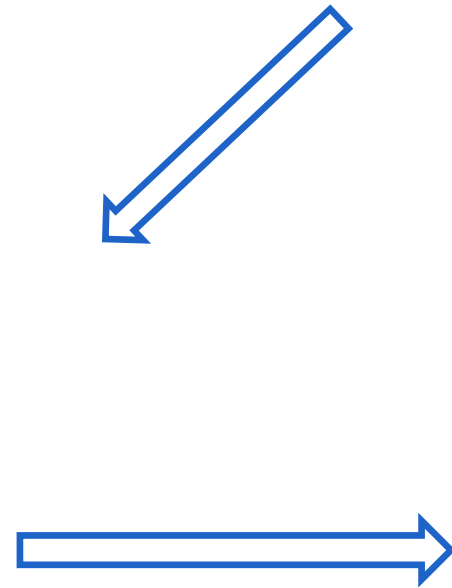

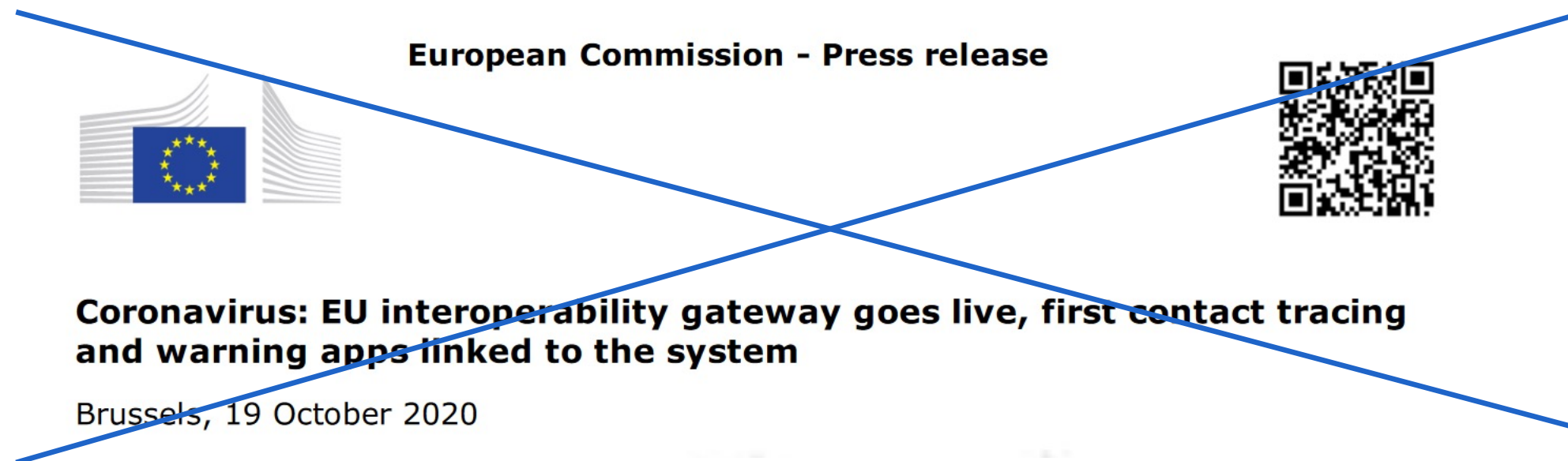
COUNCIL RECOMMENDATION (EU) 2020/1475
of 13 October 2020
on a coordinated approach to the restriction of free movement in response to the COVID-19 pandemic

LEGAL BASIS

Art 21, § 2 TFEU

Facilitating the free movement

- EU-wide framework for the issuance, verification and acceptance of COVID-19 certificates



Is there a right to a certificate?

If I'm not yet vaccinated, do I have a right to a free coronatest hopefully resulting in a negative test result certificate?

For which purposes can I use these certificates and can I use them for other purposes than the purposes mentioned in the regulation?

Is the digital green certificate a vaccination passport, or is this term to misleading when discussing this regulation?

WHAT IS IT NOT

1. Vaccination certificate as a precondition for the exercise of the free movement
2. Facilitating or encouraging the adoption of restrictions to the free movement

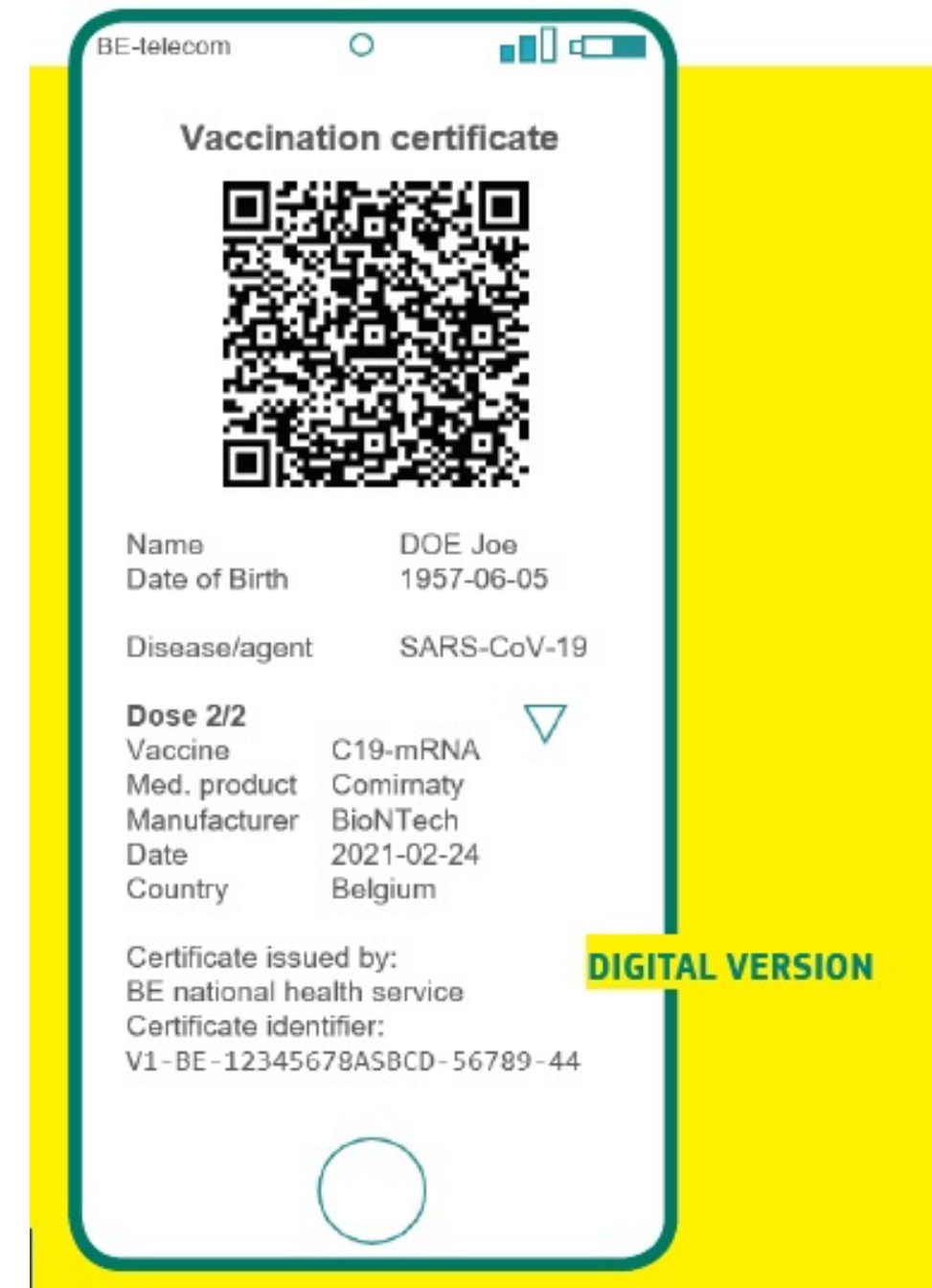
REFLECTION OF RESTRICTIONS BY MEMBER STATES

EU WIDE TRUST FRAMEWORK

- = *the rules, policies, specifications, protocols, data formats and digital infrastructure regulating and allowing for the reliable and secure issuance and verification of certificates to guarantee the certificates' trustworthiness and this by confirming their authenticity, validity and integrity*
- No for tomorrow

1. VACCINATION CERTIFICATES/ EU WIDE TRUST FRAMEWORK

- Vaccines approved by EMA
- Implementation?
 - Only a format framework
- No rules



2. TEST CERTIFICATES/ EU WIDE TRUST FRAMEWORK

- Condition: only NAAT tests and rapid antigen tests in list of Council Recommendation 2021/C 24/01
- *Where Member States require proof of a test for a covid infection as part of the restrictions to free movement put in place, they shall also accept valid test certificates issued by other Member States in compliance with this Regulation.*

3. RECOVERY CERTIFICATE/ EU WIDE TRUST FRAMEWORK

- 11 days after positive test result
- Valid: 180 days
- *Where Member States **accept proof of recovery** from covid infection as a basis for waiving restrictions to free movement put in place, they shall accept, under the same conditions, valid certificates of recovery issued by other Member States in compliance with this Regulation*

REFLECTION OF RESTRICTIONS BY MEMBER STATES

- Art 10: notification of restrictions before planned introduction
 - Reasons for restrictions
 - Scope of restrictions
 - Date and durations of restrictions

(7) The free movement of persons who do not pose a risk to public health, for example because they are immune to and cannot transmit SARS-CoV-2, should not be restricted, as such restrictions would not be necessary to achieve the objective pursued.
